

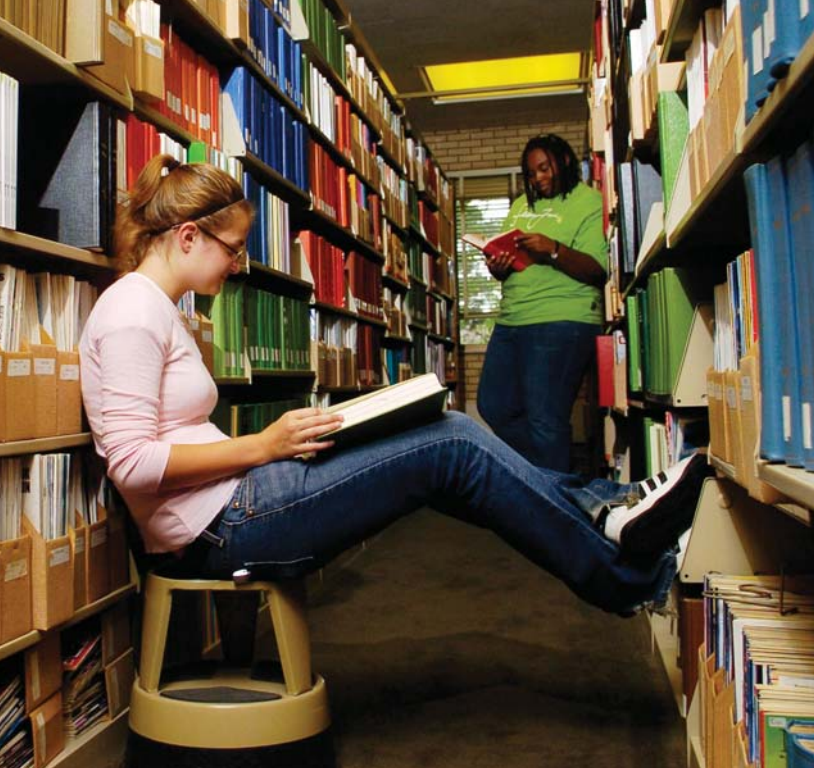


# Meeting the Challenge

## The Project

**T**he Wright Library is an integral campus facility that has served La Roche College and the North Hills community since its opening in 1967. A current funding initiative is under way to renovate the library's physical space to fully integrate learning and technology in a state-of-the-art facility. With the updates scheduled for Wright Library, it will truly become a learning center for all who use it.

**The main level of the Wright Library will feature pod study areas, a portable language laboratory, an information literacy and presentation room, and media screening facilities.** In addition, wireless technology and software-enabling communication and instruction will be available to all library users – on our campus and in the community. The lower level will house La Roche's top two academic programs: Graphic & Communication Design and Interior Design.

## The Challenge

**M**aking these changes to Wright Library will take time, dedication and funding. To that end, generous grant awards from two Pittsburgh foundations have set the stage for our raising the funds necessary to support the Wright Library renovation project. One of those awards is a challenge grant, which matches dollar-for-dollar gifts designated to this project.

Now, with your help, we must raise \$250,000 for this project by December 31, 2008, in order to obtain the foundation's matching funds and, as such, help us guide the educational future of La Roche College students.
