
OUTREACH AND SUPPORT FOR PITTSBURGH PROMISE STUDENTS

PROVIDENCE INSTITUTE

The Providence Institute at La Roche helps students who may have struggled academically in high school to reach their full potential and educational goals in college and beyond.

Through the Providence Institute, students who might not otherwise be eligible for admission to La Roche can enroll as undecided students. Providence Institute participants receive additional individualized attention from assigned peer counselors and tutors, as well as staff in the Office of Student Academic Support Services.

STUDY ABROAD+STUDY USA

La Roche students have the opportunity to travel abroad or domestically at no additional cost. Study Abroad+Study USA covers the price of travel, lodging and most meals as part of their La Roche experience. Students only are responsible for passport costs, souvenirs and some food. These short-term travel courses, led by La Roche faculty and staff, have taken students everywhere from Alaska to Cuba, to China, Greece, Italy and Russia.

SUPPORT FOR PITTSBURGH PROMISE STUDENTS



JUNIOR VISIT DAYS/CAMPUS VISIT PROGRAMS

Pittsburgh Public Schools are invited to bring a group of high school juniors to campus to learn more about the college search process.

Students can research careers, explore majors, learn about financial aid and the admissions process, and tour campus.

These visits occur during the school day, and La Roche covers the cost of school transportation and provides lunch.

ON-SITE PROGRAMMING/SCHOOL INVOLVEMENT

Staff from La Roche's Office of Admissions provide on-site college preparation and workshops upon request at Pittsburgh Promise schools.

The Office of Admissions also has a dedicated admissions counselor for Pittsburgh Promise students. This counselor serves on the Parent School Community Council at Perry High School.



FINANCIAL AID

FINANCIAL SUPPORT – PITTSBURGH PROMISE SCHOLARSHIP

La Roche automatically awards a \$2,500 scholarship to any graduate of a Pittsburgh Promise High School. This award is stackable with other La Roche merit or need-based aid. La Roche began offering this award in Fall 2016.



ACADEMIC MERIT SCHOLARSHIP

All new full-time students are automatically reviewed by the Admissions Office for merit-based scholarships. These scholarships range in value from \$7,000 to \$14,000 based on the student's grade point average, SAT and/or ACT scores, and housing status at their time of acceptance, and do not require a separate application. If you haven't taken the SAT or ACT, ask your La Roche admissions counselor about test-optional admission.

NEED-BASED AID

La Roche awards nearly \$2 million in institutional need-based grants each year.

ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIPS

Endowed scholarships are available to students as a result of the generosity of our donors who believe in the value of a La Roche education. To be eligible to apply for an endowed scholarship, students must meet the requirements established by the donors.

ACADEMIC AND STUDENT SUPPORT

THE STUDENT ACADEMIC SUPPORT SERVICES

OFFICE offers a variety of resources to help students become active, independent and confident learners. Services include:

ACADEMIC ADVISING

Academic advising begins at Welcome Days (our preregistration program for new students) and continues until the day a student graduates. SASS assists students in developing academic and future career goals, discovering the right major, navigating college policies and procedures, utilizing the resources needed for a successful college experience, and achieving the goal of graduation.

ACADEMIC COUNSELING AND TUTORING

Students receive academic support through individualized and group tutoring sessions, supplemental instruction, peer counseling, and one-on-one appointments with a professional academic counselor.

ACCESSIBILITY SERVICES

La Roche's Office of Accessibility Services empowers students with diagnosed and documented disabilities and/or medical conditions by providing reasonable accommodations and appropriate support.

This office encourages students to become confident, independent learners and advocates for their own education. All services are provided in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, and deemed appropriate for the college setting.

CAREER DEVELOPMENT

At La Roche career development is a process of self-assessment, occupation exploration and career planning that is integrated into the academic experience to ensure preparedness for the workplace.

Students embark on an educational and professional learning track that allows them to acquire professional skills through engagement in career activities and co-curricular experiences.
